### Introduction:

This booklet is designed to support your wider development away from your subjects in the time of suspended timetable. It will provide you with resources and signposts to support your next steps and allow you to develop wider personal learning both linked to your subjects and in other areas. The booklet is split into three areas, UCAS, EAT (Employment, Apprenticeship and Training) and Personal Development. Each section is designed to give you information for your desired next steps and how to prepare yourself for this. The Personal Development section will provide you resources to undertake in a wide range of fields to develop your skills further away from your chosen pathway.

# UCAS:

Within this section you will obtain information and guidance on preparing yourself for University. These should hopefully signpost you to a range of different resources which you can use to support your next step choice.

- Pre-reading lists. All universities will publish their pre-reading or recommending reading list for all courses. This will be a mix of academic books which will be designed to support elements of your learning over the course of your degree. It is useful to access these lists early and to start reading some of the texts within it. This will help you in improving your knowledge and understanding of a wide range of topics related to your chosen area of study. You should be able to access this via your chosen institutions' website.
- Open Learn provided by the Open University. Open Learn has a range of online courses from a range of different subject areas. These are free and come with a certificate of participation which highlights that you have taken part in the course. This will enable you to access online learning materials such as lectures and hopefully develop skills needed to learn at a university level. Other providers such as Future Learn also provide a range of free resources.





Student Finance. As part of the associated resources to this booklet you will find information about applying for student finance. Student finance is now open for applications. You can find help and guidance to support you at <u>https://www.ucas.com/finance/undergraduate-</u> <u>tuition-fees-and-student-loans</u>. This includes videos showing you the type of evidence you will need and talk you through the different things needed to apply. You can complete your application <u>here</u>. Many universities are also supporting with a range of webinar events designed to talk students through the process of applying. If you require support you can come into school to get help from the Sixth Form Team.

### - EAT Pathway

Within this section of the booklet you will find information about obtaining and preparing for apprenticeships. This will hopefully help you in preparing a professional CV and covering letter as well as preparing for interviews.

- Finding an apprenticeship. There are a significant number of opportunities which are listed on a range of different websites. There are many different websites which house lots of different apprenticeship opportunities within the local area, for example the Apprenticeship Hub <a href="https://www.apprenticeships.gov.uk/apprentice/find-an-apprenticeship">https://www.apprenticeships.gov.uk/apprentice/find-an-apprenticeship</a>.
- In addition to the above you can use the UCAS website to find an apprenticeship. Mr

  You should spend some time identifying some opportunities before looking at applying.
- Applying for an apprenticeship. You will most likely need to provide a CV, which should be to a professional standard. To obtain support on developing your CV visit <u>https://www.reed.co.uk/career-advice/how-to-write-a-cv/</u>. This has information on sections to include as well as what to put in each section. There is also editable CV templates should you choose to use one.
