## Message from the Head of School



As we move towards the end of September, I want to take a moment to reflect on three core principles that drive success in both our school and the wider world: consistency, high standards, and routines. These are not just abstract ideas; they are the building blocks of a positive, productive learning environment that enables each student to thrive.

**Consistency** is key to any form of progress.

When teachers, parents, and students are consistent in their efforts—whether in learning, behaviour, or attendance—momentum is built, and improvement follows naturally. As a school, we strive to ensure that our expectations remain clear and consistent across all classrooms and activities. Similarly, we encourage students to develop consistent study habits and personal routines, as these lay the foundations this year, for long-term achievement.

Equally important are the **high standards** we set for ourselves. You will know our school motto is Excellence through Endeavour, and at Hayes we aim not only to meet expectations but to exceed them. Whether in academic work, behaviour, or how we treat each other, maintaining high standards creates an environment of respect and excellence. I encourage students to take pride in their work, challenge themselves, and always aim for their personal best.

Finally, **routines**. Establishing strong daily routines helps foster discipline, reduce anxiety, and promote focus. Whether it's arriving at school on time, setting aside specific periods for homework, or preparing for the day ahead the night before, routines provide structure that supports success. The more we practice positive habits, the more naturally they come to us.

I know many students are into great routines and are already engaging in our plethora of enrichment opportunities; please see the

programme highlighted in this week's newsletter. We strongly urge students to get involved since we see the benefits participation brings to all who participate not only to their wellbeing but also in their academic achievement and sense of belonging to our school community.

Our busy programme of school visits has started in earnest again this year with students in Year 10 & 11 already enjoying the sights, sounds and culture of Munich; I am assured that their language skills were also put to very good use as they navigated this wonderful historic city. We have also this week celebrated Languages Week and a particular highlight was the MFL Bake Off with students baking and decorating internationally inspired cakes to win valuable points for their house. Teachers and other staff demonstrated their linguistic talents in a range of languages to earn raffle tickets from students and to share their own enthusiasm for languages.

Please note, there is no parking available on-site and local parking restrictions will be in force in roads near the school during the morning.








We look forward to kicking off our Change Maker Award this year in celebrating and recognising student leadership in KS3.

The awarded is routed in Student Leadership and is exclusive to Year 7-9 students. It works on the basis of students demonstrating leadership actions that can be signed off by teachers in school in their learner handbook. These leadership qualities can be recognised in lessons or enrichment. There are 24 different actions a student could take and get signed off, all linked to our Hayes Learner attributes. If a student demonstrates a particular leadership quality then staff will sign and date the relevant box on the learning passport.







### **Kevin Banks reporting the passing of Kevin Michael Weaver**

Kevin Michael Weaver who taught Media Studies and English at Hayes at the beginning of this century, died suddenly in September 2024 at the age of 61. After studying expressive arts at university in Sussex, he worked for The Independent reporting on the war in Bosnia where he was shot, and later in Africa on the plight of refugees at Goma in the Conga on the border of war torn Rwanda. He stayed at Hayes for 2 years followed by spells at schools across the capital for more than a decade, finally leaving Brixton for the peace of the Lake District, John Ruskins gateway to paradise to settle up as a painter.

Personal care, such as helping someone dress.

Managing the family budget and collecting prescriptions.

Helping to give medicine.

Helping someone communicate.

Looking after brothers and sisters.








# Musical Stars

Further to our letter earlier this week, the Local Governing Body at Hayes is responsible for setting the vision and strategic direction for the school and holding the school leaders to account for the standards of education, care and student outcomes.

We are now looking to fill two vacancies for a Parent Governor to join us in undertaking this role. It requires a commitment to and an interest in education, but you do not have to be an education specialist. Governors bring a variety of skills, interests and backgrounds to the role and this can be very useful to the school. The role is both rewarding and enjoyable. There is a comprehensive training programme provided to help you.

The Governing Body meets twice a term to carry out its duties, normally in the early evening. In addition, a governor may hold a link role to represent the Governing Body on a specific issue, or be part of a panel of governors to look at particular theme.

The term of office is four years, and it is open to all parents/carers of pupils on the school roll. Interested parents/carers are requested to complete a nomination form, including a short personal statement and a declaration of eligibility. In the event of there being more than two nominations, there will be an election with all parents/carers entitled to vote. If there is an election these statements would then be circulated with the ballot papers. If you are interested but would like to discuss any aspect of the role of a Governor or the nomination process itself before nomination, we have arranged a drop-in information session in school on **Tuesday 1st October 5pm-6pm**.

Nominations must be received by the school no later than noon on **Friday 4th October.** Should there be an election we will write to parents/carers with further details.


