Alice Jones - Hair/Make-Up/Prosthetics Artist

Many of you will already have seen the movie adaptation of *Wicked* that is currently in our cinemas, but you will probably not be aware that the character of Elphaba's make-up for the film was the work of one of our former students. Alice Jones was at Hayes from 2003 to 2010 and throughout that time she was a valued member of the Hayes Performing Arts community, taking Drama and Dance to A Level and performing in our production of *Jesus Christ Superstar*. There's also the small matter of her also being a former Head Girl... We recently caught up with Alice and she was kind enough to talk to us about her journey in the world of screen make-up.

Hi Alice. When you were at Hayes you were a very active performer. Was stage/screen make-up design always something you were hoping to go into?

I always knew I wanted to be involved in Theatre or film. I used to love watching behind the scenes footage. When I was about 13 I saw a documentary about the make-up and prosthetics in The Lord of The Rings, and my interest was fully sparked then!

What were your first "next steps" after you left Hayes?

After I left school I found a three month intensive course in makeup, hair and prosthetics for film. I knew I wanted to start working and learning whilst working out in the film industry as quickly as possible

What was your break-through moment into the industry?

I wouldn't say I had a break through moment. It took about 3-5 years of lots of hard graft, working on no budget / low budget short films and features. After about 4 years I had made enough contacts to get on to a couple of BBC TV series "New Blood" and "Hard Sun". From there my skills got better and better as did the jobs.

What are your favourite things about your job?

My favourite thing about my job is that no day is the same and that you are constantly learning and being creative. One week you could be working in a studio in London, the next you could be abroad working somewhere remote and wild. I've worked in the Sahara desert, the highlands, beaches in Greece, I feel very grateful. If sitting in an office or behind a desk doesn't appeal to someone, the film industry is a great environment to thrive!

What advice would you give to any of our students interested in the same path?

If someone was interested in the film industry there are many avenues within it to consider. Makeup, Costume, Electricians, Camera, Production, Stunts, Props and Set building...The list goes on! Do your research about what training is needed to learn that skill, it doesn't always require a degree, and there are plenty of specialist courses too. When it comes to working you have to become a bit of a detective, send emails to designers or production companies etc. There are websites for experience on short films / photo shoots, often for quite low pay but this is a great way to learn and build up your experience and contacts. Most importantly, perseverance and determination is key!

What are the biggest challenges working on a major blockbuster film like Wicked?

The Biggest challenge is most definitely the hours! Especially in the Hair and Makeup department. Often the first in and last out, I can be waking up at 3am and home at 9pm. It's not rare to work night shoots either, 6pm - 6am (I'm doing those hours right now!) You have to really enjoy your job to make it worth it. That being said, not all days and all jobs require you to work those kind of hours.

What do you remember about your time working on Hayes productions and how did the experience help you along the way? I have nothing but fond memories of working on Hayes productions. The environment of a theatre company very much reflects a film production. A group of people come together for a few months to a year to create something special, all with a passion for their craft. Great friendships are made, challenges are overcome and a lot of fun can be had along the journey. Much like a Hayes production, team work, creativity, problem solving, positivity and a can do attitude is all that's required to be a valued member of your team and the industry.
