

For the English, Maths and Science exams in week 2, you will first meet in the MAIN HALL and then move to the Sports Hall (or alternative room where you do your exam)

If you delay the start, you will be much later leaving school

AM exams

- 08.15 Put all prohibited items in your locker.
- 08.30 Register in the main hall
- 08.35 Main Hall briefing– from here you will be guided into the Sports Hall.
- 08.45 Ready to start the exam.

PM exams

- You will be first in the lunch queue on Monday & Tuesday
- 1.25pm Put all prohibited items in your locker.
- 1.35pm meet in the Main Hall.
- 1.45pm Sat and ready to start the exam in the Sports Hall.



- You can not take your bags into the Sports Hall for exams please put these in your locker
- You can not take electronic devices into the Exams (e.g. mobile phone) – please put these in your locker
- You can not wear wristwatches of any kind please leave these in your locker
- Go to the toilet **before** you go to the Main Hall.



- Any pencil cases must be see-through.
- Do not use correcting pens, fluid or tape, erasable pens, highlighters or gel pens in your answers
- Do not borrow anything from another candidate during the exam
- Water bottles these must be see through and not have any labels



- Be on time for all of your exams
- Do not talk or try to communicate with, or disturb other students once you have entered the exam room
- Exam conditions start as soon as you enter the room and do not stop until you have left the room
- If you need to speak to an invigilator raise your hand and wait. Do not turn around looking for somebody
- Following a morning exam, you go your class.

Please read the below for what your exam room will look like for week 1:

Teachers and supervising staff are advised to consider and implement the following (as far as possible) to ensure students are aware of the conditions in which the assessment(s) will be completed and the expected standards of behaviour:

- A reminder to students that the work should be their own and that there should be no form of communication with other students or their work
- Any adjustment to seating arrangements to space students out
- A reminder to student that should they need help or to ask any question during an exam they should raise their hand
